



The mission of the First United Presbyterian Church is to make disciples of all people for the glory of God through teaching, caring and worshiping.



One of my favorite cathedrals in England is in Salisbury which isn't far from where my wife used to live. The picture to the left is of the pulpit in that cathedral. The preacher has to climb a small set of stairs to enter the pulpit. Arraigned around the edge of the pulpit, are six beautifully sculpted figures (three of which you can see in the picture.). They are Elijah, Noah, Jonah, John the Baptist, Paul and Peter. Can you imagine what it would be like to preach with those six great prophets of scripture surrounding you? Inspiring, yet intimidating and sobering. The preacher in Salisbury truly is surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses! (Hebrews 12:1)

Each Sunday, we come to church and we have the audacity to believe that we are there to hear God's Word – read and spoken. In faith we believe that God's Spirit is present, revealing that message that God has for us that day.

On the wall in my office, right next to the door, is one of my favorite quotes from the great preach Martin Lloyd-Jones. He said, "To me, there is nothing more terrible for a preacher, than to be in the pulpit alone, without the conscious smile of God." What is true for the preacher is also true for every person in the church. To approach God's Word alone, without the smiling presence of God, would be frighteningly tragic.

This is why the first step in any Bible study is to pray. Pray for wisdom. Pray for guidance. Pray for insight. Pray for God's Spirit, who inspired the original writing of these words so many years ago, to inspire them afresh once again in our lives.

Of course, in our building, we have few of those beautiful representations of the saints of old. Nevertheless, they are watching. Even more significant, God is present.

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor.


**Sunday** John A. Dalles, a PCUSA pastor who has researched the history of World Communion Sunday notes this in his blog entry, reprinted from the October 7, 2002, issue of *Presbyterian Outlook*:

Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside) recalled that Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both

inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. When I asked Donald Kerr how the idea of World Communion Sunday spread from that first service to the world wide practice of today, this is what he replied,



"The concept spread very slowly at the start. People did not give it a whole lot of thought. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. World Wide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ."



Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) promoted extending the celebration to a number of churches around the world that the practice became widespread. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus


Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed. In addition, through participation in the Peace & Global Witness Offering, our church is extending Christ's peace throughout our community and our world. We begin at the communion table, with our siblings in every time and place, and we celebrate the peace we find there and

commit to building a more just and peaceful world. God's peace, empowered by God's joy, reminds us that we are connected to each other. We are not alone. Peace begins with each of us. 25% of the Offering stays with local congregations, and 25% with mid councils to unite congregations to support peacemaking in their regions. 50% of this Offering supports the work for peace and reconciliation being done by Presbyterians

across the globe. Please give as you are able this Sunday.




